

East Escarpment Conservation Area project takes flight

Ribbon cutting at first two property acquisitions provides 178-acre footprint for new Conservation Area near Devil's Punchbowl

One cold morning at the end of October, representatives from the Foundation, the Hamilton Conservation Authority, City of Hamilton and Heritage Green Community Trust came together to unveil the first two properties acquired as part of a \$5.75 million project to establish a new conservation area on the East Escarpment.


The acquisitions are the first steps of a large-scale flood control and water engineering project in both the Stoney Creek and Battlefield Creek watersheds.
